Son of Dave and Megan Stout, grandson of Ralph and Marva Ramsey, Logan is a one-year old diagnosed with Hurler's Syndrome.

Hurler's Syndrome, also called MPS-1, is an enzyme deficiency in the body that causes mental retardation, stunted growth, deafness, and eventually death due to heart failure before the age of 10.

Logan is being treated at Duke University in Durham, N.C., and received an unrelated umbilical cord transplant on August 15, 2008, after receiving nine days of chemotherapy.

The transplant introduced the missing enzyme into the body and if successful, the body will start producing the enzyme on its own.
